THE BUGS

Cut-out your favorite bug to play the game (for best results print all pages onto card)



BEE

Bees transfer pollen between flowering plants helping them to grow, breed and produce food

BUTTERFLY

While searching for nectar in flowers butterflies also help pollinate plants

SNAIL

Snails eat decomposing plants (such as rotting leaves) and are a source of food for larger animals

CATERPILLAR


Caterpillars will one day become butterflies and moths, so they are an important part of the pollination process

LADYBUG

Ladybugs help by eating aphids and other small insects that would otherwise destroy plants

WORM

By wriggling around in the earth, worms help to increase the amount of air and water that gets into the soil, this helps plants to grow better



DICE TEMPLATES

Cut around the above template, crease along the lines and stick down the tabs to create a dice. This one has been designed for discussion about what a plant needs to grow, or you can create your own design on the template on the right.

Note: sunshine, rain, and each of the insects listed above have all been incorporated into the game board to help with discussions about nature while you are playing.
